Integrated Career and Academic Preparation System

One initiative that we offer is the Integrated Career and Academic Preparation System (ICAPS). South Suburban College is offering this program in the specialization of Community Health Worker. Through this program students are given the opportunity to dual enroll in a college class in Community Health Worker and in a high school equivalency.

Bridge to Manufacturing Careers

The Bridge to Manufacturing Careers program prepares students for the high school equivalency exam while learning contextualized vocabulary for the manufacturing field.

Adult Volunteer Literacy Program

Do you need help with reading or math and don't know where to turn? If so, the Adult Volunteer Literacy program might be for you.

The learners in the Adult Volunteer Literacy (AVL) program are provided with one-on-one tutoring for a minimum of one hour per week in the areas of basic literacy, numeracy, and life skills. These services are provided to individuals who read below the ninth grade reading level.

Instruction in basic literacy/numeracy includes:

- Development of Phonetic Reading Skills
- Numeracy Skills
- Communication Skills
- · Basic Math Skills

The coordinator of the AVL program is available to help students craft resumes, aid in mock interviews, and provide job resources.

While in the AVL program, participants are able to attend or will attend on campus events.

Learners are exposed to various reading and math materials that will help them improve their life skills to secure future employment. In order to enroll in the AVL, program applicants can contact the coordinator at (708) 596-2000 ext. 2558.



Adult Basic Education/ Adult Secondary Education/ High School Equivalency

Adult Secondary Education (ASE)/ High School Equivalency (HSE)

These classes help to develop the skills required to pass the High School Equivalency exams. Adults who have not finished high school or never received a high school diploma may take advantage of this program. College and career readiness skills aligned to the Common Core Standards are taught in all of our adult education classes.

South Suburban College (SSC) offers a specialized ASE/HSE class designed for adult students whose native language is not English. This class helps prepare students for High School Equivalency and U.S. Citizenship exams, as well as college preparation.

Adult Basic Education (ABE)

It is never too late to learn the basics. SSC's ABE program helps men and women whose educational skills are below the eighth grade level. These classes will help transition students to ASE/HSE classes as well as provide career readiness training.

i-Pathways Online High School Equivalency Classes

Are you unable to attend classes on a regular basis? Does your schedule prevent you from making a "time" commitment? Then i-Pathways might be for YOU!

SSC's i-Pathways is a stand-alone ASE/HSE preparation program. There are no face-to-face classes. All work is completed online and is supervised by an ASE instructor from the Adult Education Department at SSC. *To be considered for this online program you must have a 9.0 grade level equivalency in reading and a 7.0 grade level equivalency in math.

English as a Second Language

Non-native students may improve their English language learning skills in SSC's English as a Second Language program. Each level includes a civics component to familiarize students with American history and government.

Classes include:

- Speaking
- Understanding
- Reading
- Writing
- Math
