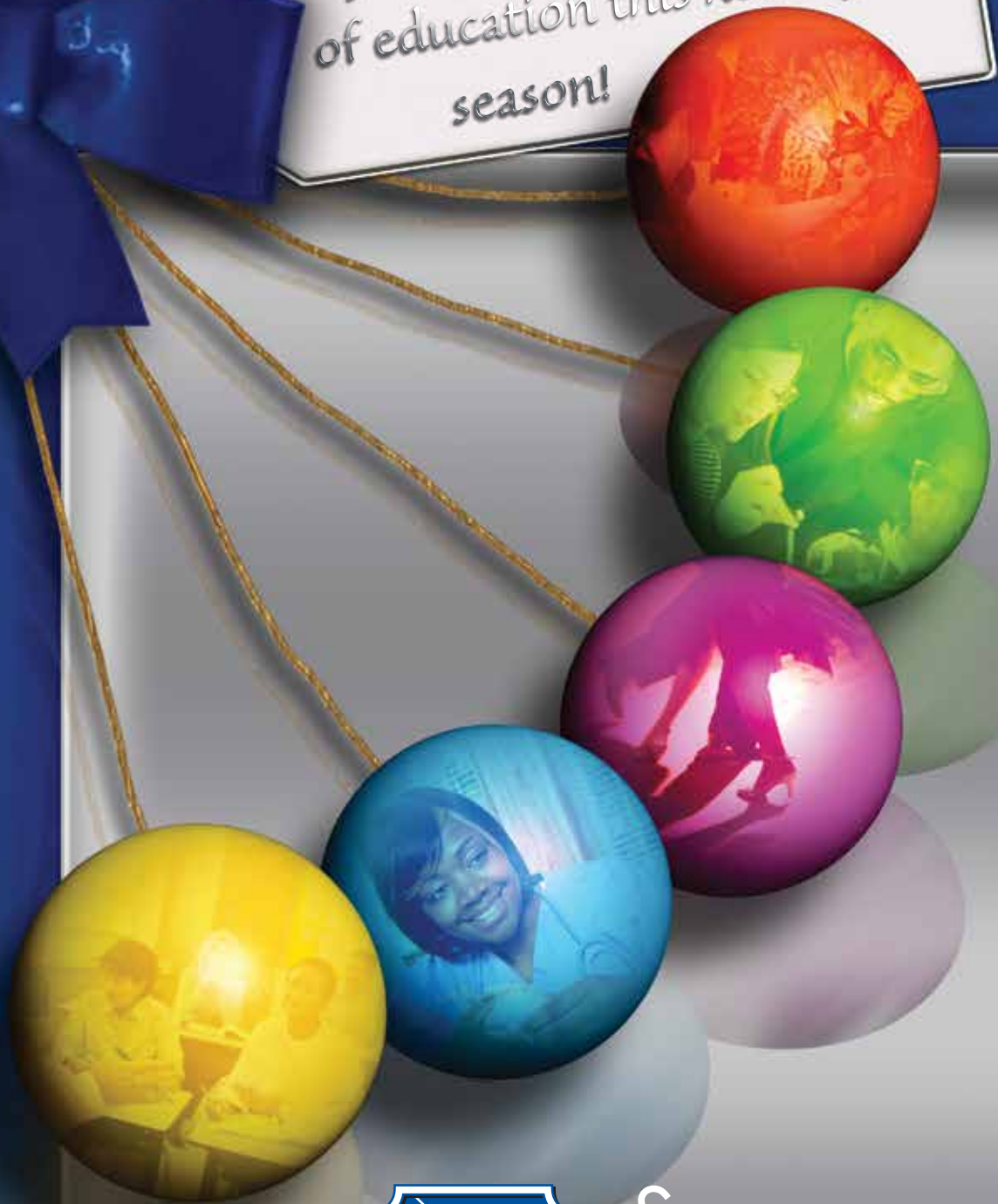

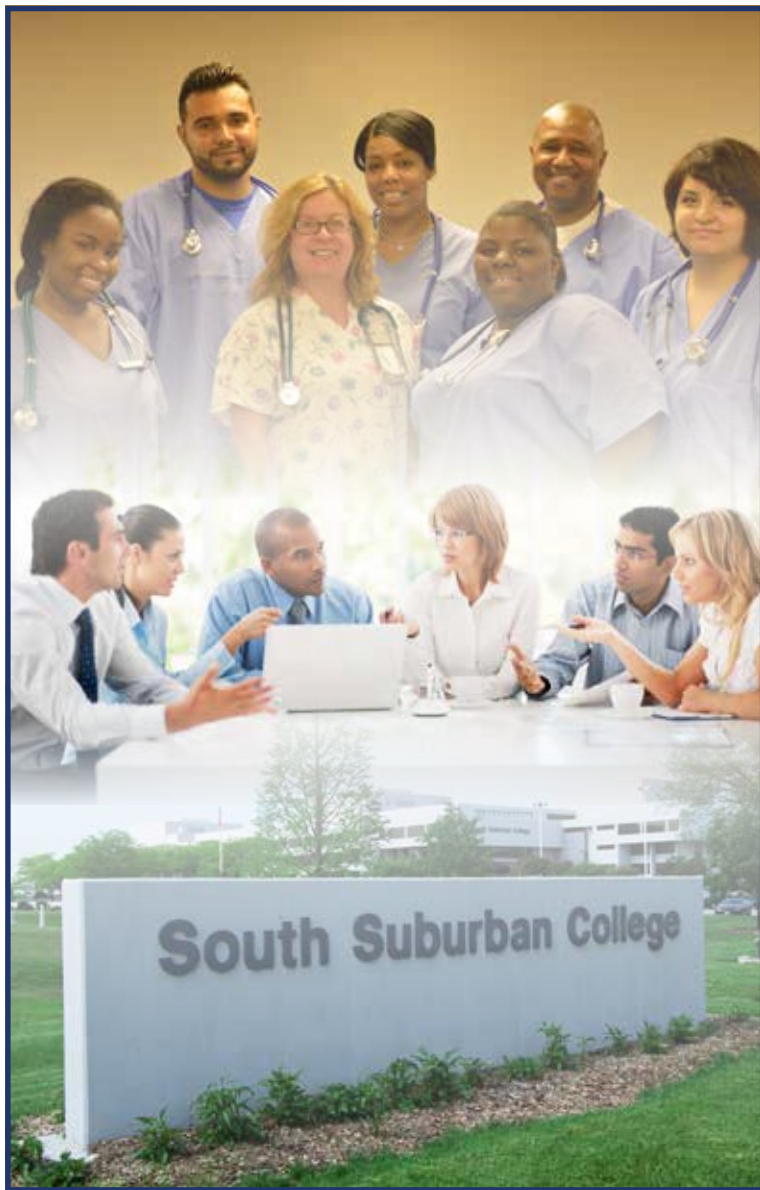

Free Tuition for Senior Citizens:

Any District 510 resident 62 years of age or older is eligible to take Continuing Education courses tuition free. The student must pay all course-related fees. Available classroom space must exist and tuition-paying students enrolled must constitute the minimum number of required students for the particular class. Senior citizens who live outside District 510 boundaries must pay both full tuition and fees.

Refund Policy:

- 100% refunds will be issued during the first week of class.
- Refunds of tuition and fees will occur only after the student has completed a "drop" through their portal during designated "drop" periods.
- Attendance in any class and receipt of a grade is subject to official enrollment in and payment of the full tuition for the class.
- No registration changes will be accepted after the 10th day of the term for the particular class.
- The College will refund 100% of tuition and fees if a course or workshop is canceled. Classes may be canceled due to insufficient class enrollment.
- For mini-courses or workshops beginning after October 2014 must complete a drop through their portal 48 hours prior to the first class session. There will be no refunds after the class begins. Failure to attend class will not be granted a refund.

**Refund checks will be mailed approximately three weeks after the stated deadline.*

**NOTE: South Suburban College cannot authorize withdrawals on the basis of information received by telephone.*

Tuition \$104 Fee \$99

This is a college credit class with limited seating for non-credit students. Minimum age recommended for class is 18.

A general introductory course investigating the visual arts with an emphasis placed on developing an aesthetic and cross cultural awareness of and appreciation for various visual forms of expression: i.e., painting, sculpture, architecture, cinematography and video.

ART E11–Drawing I

Tuition \$104 Fee \$99

This is a college credit class with limited seating for non-credit students. Minimum age recommended for class is 18.

An introduction to drawing with emphasis on representation, perceptual growth and individual expression. Control in line, value and spatial illusion is developed through the use of a variety of art media and tools.

ART E40–Photography I, Digital

Tuition \$104 Fee \$99

This is a college credit class with limited seating for non-credit students. Minimum age recommended for class is 18.

A basic introductory photography course that covers the principles and fine art aesthetics of black and white photography in a digital format including: composition, equipment selection and use; image processing, manipulation, correction and output in the digital darkroom; lenses, aperture shutter speed, focal plane. A brief history of photography is covered. 35mm manual SLR camera or digital camera with full manual controls; tripod.

ART E46–Sculpture I

Tuition \$104 Fee \$99

This is a college credit class with limited seating for non-credit students. Minimum age recommended for class is 18.

This course introduces basic sculpture-making methods, procedures and their relationship to the artist concepts, materials and tools. Processes used: modeling, mold-making, carving, resin lamination, fabrication in wood and metal, welding and foundry practices. Lecture, demonstrations, slide presentations and discussions included.

ART E54–Painting Studio

Tuition \$104 Fee \$99

This is a college credit class with limited seating for non-credit students. Minimum age recommended for class is 18.

This course offers opportunity for individual concentration in a thematic approach to developing a personal aesthetic for the advanced student. Projects will be developed as necessary for furthering the personal aesthetic.

A beginning digital computer-based introduction to raster and vector visual image generation, manipulation and output. Students will use Adobe Illustrator and Photoshop on Macintosh computers along with cameras, scanners and printers to create, manipulate and output images. No previous computer experience is required.

ART E78–Ceramics II

Tuition \$104 Fee \$99

This is a college credit class with limited seating for non-credit students. Minimum age recommended for class is 18.

Emphasizing in-depth exploration of the techniques and conceptual theories of pottery. Wheel-throwing and hand-building processes combined with procedures on glazing, surface decorations, clay and glaze theory.

ART E78 731 2:30-5:40p MW MA-4348 Kirkpatrick 2/9-5/13

ART E91–Web Design

Tuition \$104 Fee \$99

Prerequisite: Computer experience required

This is a college credit class with limited seating for non-credit students. Minimum age recommended for class is 18.

This course provides an integrated approach to web design and development, focusing on establishing an effective online presence through design, development, and management of websites using HTML, Dreamweaver and Flash.

ART E91 701 9:00-11:45a MW MA-4431 Gomez 1/12-5/13

HMK C11–Basic Knit

Fee \$69

No prior knowledge of knitting is required. While learning the basics knitting techniques, learn to create a variety of practical projects. Although the course is taught on a basic level, it is open to anyone who would like to learn or review the formation of basic knit stitches, how to knit “Continental Style,” how to form simple pattern stitches, read published knitting patterns and charts, finishing techniques, complete a sampler of several pattern swatches, and finish several small projects. For those students interested in improving their skills beyond the basics, the course maybe repeated on an advanced level. Students are required to have the following supplies the first night of class: light-colored (solid or variegated) yarn in worsted weight, a pair of size #8 knitting needles (preferably in a shorter length), scissors, steel yarn needle, and note-taking materials. A more detailed supply list will be provided during the first class session.

HMK C11 701 7:00-9:00p T MA-3240 Licko-Keel 2/24-4/21

HMK E16–Art of Crocheting

Fee \$69

No prior knowledge of crocheting needed for this course, but it is a good way to polish or brush up on long-forgotten skills. The purpose of this course is to teach basic crochet techniques on a beginner’s level. Upon completion of the basic course, students will know how to form all of the basic crochet stitches, read patterns and basic crochet symbols, and will have completed a gauge sampler and several small projects. With this introduction and a few inexpensive tools and materials, it should be possible to make most of the crochet projects featured in currently available craft periodicals. For those students interested in improving their skills beyond the basics, the course may be repeated on an advanced level. Students are required to have the following supplies the first night of class: light colored (solid or variegated) yarn in worsted weight, crochet hooks in a medium selections of sizes, (G, H, and I are recommended), a pair of scissors, and note-taking materials.

PHO E32–Digital Photography-Part I

Fee \$99

This course is designed for the beginning student as an Introduction to Photography. It will deal with all types of Digital Single Lens Reflex (DSLR) cameras. Through weekly photographic assignments in areas such as depth of field, motion, design, portraiture and other topics, the students will learn the operations of their camera as well as “photographic seeing” and composition. Class will be held at the Oak Forest Center in Oak Forest, IL.

PHO E34–Digital Photography-Part II

Fee \$99

This course is a continuation of Digital Photography I. Further in-depth assignments will be covered including White Balance, Black & White Digital Photos, and Advanced Camera Techniques. Class will be held at the Oak Forest Center in Oak Forest, IL.

BUS E02–Human Relations in Organizations

Tuition \$104 Fee \$99

This is a college credit class with limited seating for non-credit students. Minimum age recommended for class is 18.

This course is designed to provide students with a wide range of interpersonal skills needed in today's workplace. The foundation for contemporary human relations will include seven themes: Communication, Self-Awareness, Self-Acceptance, Motivation, Trust, Self-Disclosure, and Conflict Management.

Fee \$95

Learn how to develop your product or service, find the best suppliers, best customers, work with banks, currency issues, insurance companies, government agencies and other trade entities. Weekly live sessions online and after the formal nine weeks' course; you may join a listserv of ex-students, so access to the instructor and peers never ends. BUS E14–Organization for Small Business

Tuition \$53 Fee \$49

This is a college credit class with limited seating for non-credit students. Minimum age recommended for class is 18.

This course is designed to provide the small business owner with the managerial principles of planning, organizing, influencing, and controlling. Included is building a business plan with an organizational plan for combining and allocating resources. Class will be held at the Oak Forest Center in Oak Forest, IL.

BUS E46–How to Start Your Own Small Business

Tuition \$53 Fee \$49

This is a college credit class with limited seating for non-credit students. Minimum age recommended for class is 18.

The fundamentals of organization and operation of a small business with special attention given to goal setting, market identification and financial planning. Class will be held at the Oak Forest Center in Oak Forest, IL.

BUS E47–Marketing for Small Business

Tuition \$53 Fee \$49

This is a college credit class with limited seating for non-credit students. Minimum age recommended for class is 18.

This course is designed to introduce the small business owner or proprietor to the Principles of Marketing. Included is a marketing plan that will detail marketing strategy, pricing, sales tactics, service and warranty policies, promotion, distribution, desirability of product, market research and an ongoing market evaluation. Class will be held at the Oak Forest Center in Oak Forest, IL.

BUS E47 731 8:00-12:00p S OFC-5680 Butcher 3/21-4/11

BUS E97–Accounting and Finance for Small Business

Tuition \$53 Fee \$49

This is a college credit class with limited seating for non-credit students. Minimum age recommended for class is 18.

This course is intended to introduce the small business owner or proprietor to the basic records necessary for small business accounting and finance. How to establish and interpret small business accounting by utilizing budgets, aging receivables and payables, and preparing financial statements will be covered. Class will be held at the Oak Forest Center in Oak Forest, IL.

BUS E97 731 8:00-12:00p S OFC-5680 Thomas 4/18-5/9

RES E05–Real Estate Transactions

Tuition \$104 Fee \$99

This is a college credit class with limited seating for non-credit students. Minimum age recommended for class is 18.

This course is designed to meet the 75-hour pre-licensing curriculum requirements for real estate brokers, set forth by the State of Illinois. The course covers topic areas such as Illinois license law, agency, state and federal law, relationships with employing brokers, working with sellers and buyers, real property, fair housing, ownership, contracts, real estate valuation, environmental issues, construction, real estate closings, advertising, property management, and commercial real estate. The course mixes presentation of facts, concepts, and key terms with real-life scenarios to illustrate the topics being taught; as well as opportunities for assessment to help you apply your new knowledge.

ART E91–Web Design

Tuition \$104 Fee \$99

Prerequisite: Computer experience required

This is a college credit class with limited seating for non-credit students. Minimum age recommended for class is 18.

This course provides an integrated approach to web design and development, focusing on establishing an effective online presence through design, development, and management of websites using HTML, Dreamweaver and Flash.

ART E91 701 9:00-11:45a MW MA-4431 1/12-5/13

BUS E07–Computers for Beginners

Fee \$149

A fun course designed to teach you the basics of word processing, email, and the internet. If you know nothing about how to use your computer this class is for you. Class will be held at Thornwood High School in South Holland, IL.

BUS E07 701 6:30-8:30p T TW-TBD Paarlberg 2/17-4/21

BUS E49–Computers for Seniors

Fee \$89

This course is for all ages, you will learn how to get started in using your computer, from getting your email, to setting up an email account to how to open a new window, type into Word docs, how to save and delete items and some minor repairs or housekeeping of your system.

BUS E23–Computer Awareness-(Virus Removal Protection)

Fee \$109

This course does not cover basic computer skills; this is a prerequisite of computer basics, which you can sign up for taking both on the same day, if you are up to the challenge. You will learn how to find and remove computer viruses, identify threats, and practice computer safety. Also, you will learn how to add memory, and basic computer housekeeping to help keep your machine running fast.

BUS E23 701 1:15-2:15p F OFC-5690 Demitro 2/20-4/17

CIS E18–Cisco IT Essentials v5 A+ Certification

Fee \$522

This is a college credit class with limited seating for non-credit students. Minimum age recommended for class is 18.

This course covers the fundamentals of computer hardware and software as well as advanced concepts. Students who complete this course will be able to describe the internal components of a computer, assemble a computer system, install an operating system, and troubleshoot using system tools and diagnostic software. Students will also be able to connect to the Internet and share resources in a network environment. New topics included in this version include the Microsoft Windows 7 operating system and mobile devices, while the networking and troubleshooting topics have been expanded. Hands-on lab activities will continue to be an essential element of the course. In support of this, virtual learning tools are integrated into this course. The Virtual Laptop and Virtual Desktop are stand-alone tools designed to supplement classroom learning and provide an interactive “hands-on” experience in learning environments with limited physical equipment. Packet Tracer activities will be designed for use with Packet Tracer 5.3.x. The inclusion of Packet Tracer will allow alignment to new CompTIA networking certification objectives without requiring academies to purchase extra networking equipment. Italicized class will be held at the Oak Forest Center in Oak Forest, IL.

CIS E45–Adobe Flash Web Design

Fee \$189

This course will teach you the basics of how use Adobe Flash. Students will learn about key frames, timeline, objects, tweening, shape, and how to insert music on page. You will create A WEBSITE IN FLASH. We will discuss frame animations. Time line, frame rates

Prerequisite: CIS E88 or equivalent

This is a college credit class with limited seating for non-credit students. Minimum age recommended for class is 18.

The Cisco CCNA Exploration curriculum helps students prepare for entry-level career opportunities, continuing education, and the globally recognized CCNA certification. CCNA Exploration teaches networking. This is the first of a 4 module series. The following classes are CIS E51, CIS E52, and CIS E53. At the completion of CIS 120 students have the option of taking the Cisco CCENT Certification exam. Class will be held at the Oak Forest Center in Oak Forest, IL.

Students will be introduced to advanced website design and integration. Multiple web servers using different operating systems will be used. Students will learn to integrate various Web applications across multiple servers into a single point of access. This course prepares the student for the second Cisco certification test. Class will be held at the Oak Forest Center in Oak Forest, IL.

CIS E52–Cisco CCNA Exploration - LAN Switching & Wireless

Fee \$348

Prerequisite: CIS E51

This is a college credit class with limited seating for non-credit students. Minimum age recommended for class is 18.

The course is designed to provide a hands-on experience in implementing and configuring complex Cisco multi-protocol routers and switches. The class will include an introduction to switched Ethernet networks, Virtual LAN technology, spanning-tree protocols and configuration of Cisco switching devices. The class will also include advanced router concepts including access list management, IPX and IP filtering, traffic management, and IGRP implementation. Students will demonstrate the use of the Cisco IOS to configure network switching and routing devices. This course prepares the student for the third Cisco certification test. Class will be held at the Oak Forest Center in Oak Forest, IL.

The second part of the class involves the design, implementation, configuration, and demonstration of a fully functional enterprise Intranet including HTTP, FTP, NNTP and email services. This course prepares the student for the Cisco certification test. Class will be held at the Oak Forest Center in Oak Forest, IL.

CIS E88–Net+ Certification

Fee \$895

Prerequisite: MIS E04 or equivalent

This is a college credit class with limited seating for non-credit students. Minimum age recommended for class is 18.

The Network+ certification ensures that the successful candidate has the important knowledge and skills necessary to manage, maintain, troubleshoot, install, operate and configure basic network infrastructure, describe networking technologies, basic design principles, and adhere to wiring standards and use testing tools. Although not a prerequisite, it is recommended that CompTIA Network+ candidates have experience in network support or administration or adequate academic training, along with a CompTIA A+ certification. The Network+ certification is an internationally recognized validation of the technical knowledge required of foundation-level IT network practitioners. The CompTIA Network+ and A+ exams can be applied together toward both the Microsoft Certified Systems Administrator (MCSA) and Cisco CCNA Certified programs.

Job Training Department

The Job Training Department at South Suburban College offers Employment Training Programs and services based upon the needs of the individual to obtain or retain employment for self-sufficiency. Services for local and regional employers include: identifying skilled workers and provision of On-the-Job Training Programs.

Rebound Program

This tuition-free program is for residents of College District 510 who have become unemployed. Qualified Rebound Students do not pay tuition costs or fees, only their books. The Rebound courses are offered in 19 academic areas ranging from healthcare to technology, within class sections that have the capacity for growth. Some of the programs may require prerequisites or other provisions for entry.

Workforce Investment Act (WIA) Programs

WIA is intended to be customer-focused, to assist individuals to access the tools needed to manage their careers through information and high quality services. Individuals must meet eligibility and suitability criteria.

There are three levels of service:

- Core services - Outreach, job search and placement assistance, and labor market information are available for all job seekers;
- Intensive services - Includes more comprehensive assessments, development of individual employment plans and counseling and career planning; and
- Training services - Customers unable to obtain other grant assistance, including federal Pell grants may receive funds for Occupational Training, On-the-Job Training, Customized Training and training in basic skills.

The following are the WIA Programs available:

Dislocated Worker Program (ages 18+)

Individuals who:

- Are eligible for or have exhausted unemployment insurance;
- Have demonstrated an appropriate attachment to the workforce, and unlikely to return to a previous industry or occupation;
- Have been terminated or laid off or received notification of termination or layoff from employment as a result of a permanent closure or substantial layoff;
- Were self-employed but are unemployed as a result of general economic conditions or a natural disaster;
- Are displaced homemakers who are no longer supported by another family member.

Adult Program (ages 18+)

- All adult participants are eligible to receive core services
- Priority for intensive and training services is given to public assistance recipients or other low-income individuals
- Individuals receive job search assistance to obtain employment that allows for self-sufficiency
- Transportation assistance and support services are available based on need and funding

Youth Program (ages 17-21)

Low income individuals who meet at least one barrier to employment will be provided with:

- Paid and unpaid work experiences including internships and job shadowing;
- Tutoring, study skills training and instruction leading to the completion of post-secondary schooling;
- Occupational skill training, adult mentoring and leadership development opportunities;
- Transportation assistance;
- Follow up services for not less than 12 months after the participant completes the program;
- Assistance in obtaining viable permanent employment.

HOM E33–Beginning & Advanced Woodworking & Cabinetmaking

Fee \$129

This course provides fundamental experience in working with hand tools, portable power tools, and woodworking machinery, through related projects agreed upon between the student and instructor, based on the student's previous experience in woodworking. The basic units covered are: project planning, material quantity estimating, shop safety, use of hand and machine tools, wood turning, project construction and wood finishing. Class will be held at Thornwood High School in South Holland, IL.

Food Service Sanitation

FDS E10–Food Service Certification

Fee \$119

This course is designed to assist the manager or potential manager of any food service operation to apply food service sanitation. Students MUST attend all class sessions-to be eligible to take exam no exceptions. A refresher course option is no longer available. Once you are licensed, you will have to take this course every five years as part of the license renewal process. Required textbook is available in the College bookstore and must be purchased before first class meeting. Classes will be held at the Oak Forest Center in Oak Forest, IL.

NAS E01–Basic Nurse Assistant Training Program

Fee \$1299-(Books and supplies included)

This course is designed to prepare students to assist in caring for patients and to be effective members of the nursing team under the supervision of the registered nurse and licensed practical nurse. This course provides instruction in basic nursing skills through lecture, campus laboratory and supervised clinical experiences in a long term care facility. By the end of this course the student will demonstrate 21 Critical Basis Nursing Skills through a combination of lecture, lab and supervised clinical experiences at a long-term health care facility. After successful completion of the program, students are eligible to take the State of Illinois Nursing Assistant Certification Examination. Each individual who successfully passes this exam will then be placed on the State Registry for Health Care Workers. Theory & Lab classes held at the Oak Forest Center in Oak Forest, IL. Clinical will be held at designated sites.

Tuition \$104 Fee \$99

This is a college credit class with limited seating for non-credit students. Minimum age recommended for class is 18.

This course provides an overview of the health care system and community health work. Students will gain an understanding of the role of community health workers, the scope of their function and services, and how they interact with other health personnel and resources. It includes principles of effective verbal and non-verbal communication to assist students in encouraging positive interaction.

CHW E05–Assessing Community Resources

Tuition \$104 Fee \$99

This is a college credit class with limited seating for non-credit students. Minimum age recommended for class is 18.

This course will provide students with a brief overview of public health, its services and core functions in the protection and promotion of health and prevention of disease and injury. It will include selected international, national and local health organizations that influence the public health.

CHW E10–Community Health Development

Tuition \$104 Fee \$99

This course gives the students information about identifying the relationship of diet to disease. Attention is given to the treatment of disease by diet modification.
