



Financial Aid Withdrawal Consent Form

This form is required when a student is a financial aid recipient and has initiated an official course withdrawal.

Any dropped class after the 100% refund period is considered a withdrawal.

Withdrawals have the following consequences:

- ❖ A W grade will be given for the class. The W grade will appear on the student's transcript.
- ❖ Tuition will be charged for the withdrawn class.

Financial Aid Consequences Of Withdrawing From Class:

- ❖ Withdrawing from all classes before 60% of the semester is over will result in your financial aid award being prorated.

When a financial aid award is prorated it means that the award is lowered to reflect the amount of time the student was in attendance.

Withdrawing From All Classes Usually Results In A Student Bill

- ❖ Withdrawing from a class that a student never attended will cause a reduction in the student's award amount. *Federal guidelines state the classes that are not attended cannot be counted toward a student's enrollment status; therefore the student's award will be lowered to reflect a new enrollment status.*

The Reduction In Award Amount May Cause A Student Bill.

- ❖ Withdrawing from a class or classes may affect your satisfactory academic progress SAP and as a result might jeopardize your eligibility for future financial aid.

In order to be in good SAP standing and continue to receive financial aid a student must:

- ◆ Maintain a 2.0 Cumulative GPA
- ◆ Not exceed maximum attempted hours for their academic program
- ◆ Complete 2/3 or 67% of ALL classes attempted.

Withdrawals negatively affect completion rates!
