Patient care technicians (PCT) assist physicians, nurses, and other healthcare practitioners in caring for patients. PCTs usually work in a hospital environment under the supervision of other medical staff, in which a technician will monitor patients, assist them with various daily activities, create daily status reports, conduct tests such as EKGs, and obtain specimens such as blood for testing. Upon completion of the PCT Basic Certificate, students will be eligible to sit for their Patient Care Technician national certification exam. Additionally, there will be options available to obtain additional certification in Nursing Assisting, Phlebotomy as well as Electrocardiography Technician.

Eligible participants will receive tuition assistance, access to emergency funds for transportation, childcare, and other emergencies, financial assistance to cover the cost of books and materials, career networking and development opportunities, advisement (personal, academic, and career), tutoring, and other supportive services.
