EMERGENCY RESPONSE PLAN WHAT TO DO IF APPROACHED BY IMMIGRATION OFFICIALS (ICE)

▲ IF APPROACHED BY ICE OR FEDERAL IMMIGRATION AGENTS:

- Remain calm. Do not run or panic.
- You have the right to remain silent.

You do not have to answer questions about your immigration status, birthplace, or how you entered the U.S.

- **Do not sign anything** without first speaking to an attorney.
- Ask if you are free to leave. If yes, walk away calmly.
- If detained, say:

"I am exercising my right to remain silent and would like to speak to an attorney."

CAMPUS POLICY ON IMMIGRATION ENFORCEMENT:

- South Suburban College is committed to maintaining a safe, inclusive environment for all students, staff, and faculty.
- Immigration enforcement is not permitted on campus without a valid judicial warrant.
- Campus Police do not enforce federal immigration laws.
