WHAT TO DO IF APPROACHED BY IMMIGRATION OFFICIALS (ICE)
South Suburban College – In Compliance with the Illinois Trust Act

 **IF APPROACHED BY ICE OR FEDERAL IMMIGRATION AGENTS:**

- **Remain calm.** Do not run or panic.
 - **You have the right to remain silent.**
You do not have to answer questions about your immigration status, birthplace, or how you entered the U.S.
 - **Do not sign anything** without first speaking to an attorney.
 - **Ask if you are free to leave.** If yes, walk away calmly.
 - **If detained, say:**
"I am exercising my right to remain silent and would like to speak to an attorney."
